#### Mission Statement:

The Betsey Mills Club is a historic community center dedicated to serving the community with opportunities for growth in health, character and service through a variety of fitness programs, educational services and community based events.

## **A Community Center**

The Betsey Mills Club was founded in 1911 under the name The Girls' Monday Club. The Monday Club was the result of a sewing class started in 1898 in Marietta by Mrs. Betsey Mills and other community minded women. The first permanent home of the Monday Club was the white frame house on the corner of Fourth and Putnam Streets.

The house was the birthplace of Mrs. Mills and also of her nephew, Vice President Charles G. Dawes. The home was donated by Mr. and Mrs. William Mills in 1916. The home became the nucleus of the present complex constructed by Mr. Mills as a memorial to his wife. The Betsey Mills as you see it today was dedicated on June 13, 1927 and donated by Mr. Mills to the community of Marietta.

Today, The Betsey continues to offer programs and services for every member of the community. Pool therapy and warm water arthritis workout are just a few of the health enhancement programs available at The Betsey. Children's programs include a state licensed Child Care and Preschool Center, day camps, and classes for all ages. Rooms are also available for meetings, special events, and classes. The needs and desires of community members determine what classes and activities are offered.

The Betsey Mills is truly a community facility. Locally administrated and locally financed, The Betsey Mills is in tune with the needs of the community.

Truly, a place to care for each other.

Financials: In 2019 program revenue was \$494,657, rental revenue was \$57,910, and total revenue was \$622,687. Due to Covid, 2020 looked different with \$321,506 in program revenue, \$61,148 in rental revenue, and \$601,796 in total revenue. Looking back at these past years helps show us we are trending in a positive direction!

## **Summer Fundraising Drive**

In 2021, an annual summer campaign returned \$52,758.71 in donations, totaling over \$25,000 more than last year's campaign!

In 2021, we received grant funding from the Marietta Welfare League (\$6,000), the Community Foundation (\$12,000), The Sisters Health Foundation (\$2,500), Peoples Bank (\$1,000), Hall Financial (\$2,000) and Marietta Noon Rotary (500).

# Completed Projects

Because of YOUR support, we have been able to complete the following projects this past year!

## \*Parlor Restoration Project Completed!\*

This \$35,000 project has been appreciated! We are receiving more calls for showers, receptions, meetings, and gatherings in our beautiful, historical Parlor Room at The Betsey Mills Club.

## \*New Drainage System in Playground\*

The layers of mulch in the playground have been taken out, a drainage system was put in to help with water issues in the basement, and beautiful pea gravel is now in the playground area with new fencing.

#### \*New Windows in Gymnasium\*

Windows were purchased and installed above the Playground area/gymnasium. Safety is a priority for our children, and we want them to be able to play outside for years to come!

## \*New Bounce Houses and Air Conditioning Fan\*

Bounce House Birthday Parties are available in the Betsey Mills Gymnasium, and we can't be any more exited to host more events! An air conditioning fan helps with gym use year-round.

## \*Painting Projects\*

The exterior of the Little Sprouts House has been painted, and we are looking forward to painting the trim on the main Betsey building in 2022.

## \*New Toddler Room Has Been Created\*

With a waiting list of 40 families for Toddler Care, we are opening up a new room! By moving a childcare room (age 3-5) to the upstairs and renovating the downstairs room for toddlers, we will grow our childcare offerings and add revenue.

### \*Dining Room Restoration Project Has Begun!\*

The total cost is projected to be \$60,000 to paint the walls, ceilings, and trim, restore the hardwood flooring, refurbish tables, purchase new chairs, create a new cabinet, and purchase a big screen tv! (enclosed in cabinet). (\$50,000 raised! Project has begun!) Thank you to our Restoration Committee: Dee Arnold, Mary Summers, Nann Welch, Theresa Morrison, and Debbie Lazorik. You do so much for The Betsey Mills Club! Thank you!

## **Betsey's Childcare Programs**

Betsey's Learning Tree and Little Sprouts are state certified and inspected twice annually by the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services. The center provides loving, nurturing care for children ages 6 weeks - 12 years old in a structured, stimulating, challenging and safe environment.

Our philosophy is children's work is play. Through play, children learn to communicate, share and problem solve, as well as discover their own creativity. Through class time and circle time activities, children are introduced to the skills necessary to function in the formal educational environment that they will encounter in elementary school. All lesson plans are prepared to meet Ohio Department of Education Early Learning Preschool Content Standards and Infant/Toddler Guidelines. We also focus on enhancing a child's self-esteem while encouraging social skills and teaching children not what to learn, but how to learn in a fun way. We believe early experiences last a lifetime!

All staff members are required to be certified in CPR, First Aid, Communicable Disease, Child Abuse, fingerprinted every five years and receive a medical exam before employment.

We are excited to be offering a safe, fun, and healthy new before and after school program for our community. Hours are 7am to beginning of school and end of school to 5:30pm.

#### Kids Night Out:

Each Friday evening, Betsey Mills staff, along with Marietta College students host a fun evening for kids to be engaged in activities while parents also get a night out at a low monthly cost.

Our Childcare team is going above and beyond to take extra trainings and qualify for higher standards and more quality care for our children involved in the Little Sprouts Infant and Toddler Center and The Betsey's Learning Tree.

The **New Toddler Room** will open soon and we are excited to call families on our waitlist and tell them we have availability!
